What is "The Gospel"?

There are alot of misconceptions about the Gospel.

For example, many times missionaries have gone to foreign countries and were appalled at the dress and lifestyle of the natives. They busied themselves with making clothes for them to wear, and teaching them a set of moral rules to follow. As a result, the native's exterior changed, but their hearts often did not. The Gospel is not to be confused with living a good moral life, or following a code of ethics. Even the pagan Shinto, Hindo, and Muslim religions have a moral code, but do not teach THE gospel.

At other times, perhaps in response to excess in other religions or denominations, good hearted people have crafted carefully worded statements precisely defining "good doctrine". Many churches recite these doctrinal statements on a regular basis, as a part of worship services. But, the gospel is not the same as accepting a statement of faith, or reciting a creed.

You will often hear people say that they admire Jesus as a good man, prophet or teacher: and that they try to live their lives by His principles of doing good and helping people. At the same time, they would deny the Deity of Jesus, and don't want to hear anything about his blood sacrifice or resurrection. The gospel is not "good advice to follow"

Considering the vast number of religions and churches available today, how does one know which religion to follow? Even limiting your search to "Christian" denominations, a careful comparison of the Bible, and these different churches will lead you to despair in choosing which religious system is the best. Joseph Smith came to the same conclusion and started his own religion, teaching "another Jesus", and "another gospel". The gospel is not a religious system

The Gospel is not: a code of ethics or morals, a creed to be accepted, a system of religion to be adhered to, or good advice to follow, It is the power of God unto salvation.

The Gospel is a message concerning Jesus Christ, The God Man, who is able to save us from our sins. The Gospel is the news of Jesus' sinless life, substitutionary death on the cross, and resurrection from the dead after three days in the tomb (1 Corinthians 15:1-5). That is the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ that is to be preached to every creature (Mark 16:15). Paul said that the Gospel involved preaching "Christ Jesus the Lord" (2 Corinthians 4:3-5)

'Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.' (John 15:16)

YE HAVE NOT CHOSEN ME, BUT I HAVE CHOSEN YOU

When we think of the beginning and basis of our confidence, It needs to be seen that on a foundational level, GOD is the primary worker in salvation. This choice did not come about as a result of our own work or desire, rather, it has its genesis in that we were chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world, (**Ep 1:3-5**). Even on an individual level, although there is most definitely personal involvement in a response to the gospel, there is no one who can trace back their own personal decision to respond in faith towards GOD to anything other than the circumstances present in their lives by divine appointment.

This has always been the case from the very beginning. God's choice is what has determined, led, and shaped the course of human history;

It is GOD who chose Abram, called him out; "Thou art the LORD the God, who didst choose Abram, and broughtest him forth out of Ur of the Chaldees, and gavest him the name of Abraham" (Neh 9:7) What really could Abram have done at the time of his calling to cause these things to happen? Abram was called out of Ur, to a place where GOD would show him.

It is GOD who promised Abraham his descendants would bless the whole earth, it is GOD who gave Abraham a son, GOD who blessed Isaac with Jacob, and GOD who made Jacob's descendants into this nation, Israel.

"For the Lord hath chosen Jacob unto himself, and Israel for his peculiar treasure." (Psalm 135:4)

It is GOD who chose Moses to lead his chosen people out of Egypt. He chose Moses to lead this nation, to represent them at this crucial time. It is GOD who chose to bring this people into the promised land, and chose them as his people in the earth, to distinguish them from all others.

"Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord; and the people whom he hath chosen for his own inheritance"

(Psalms 33:12)

And, it is GOD who chose the apostle Paul to be the apostle to the gentiles;

"But the Lord said unto him, Go thy way: for he is a chosen vessel unto me, to bear my name before the Gentiles, and kings, and the children of Israel" (Acts 9:15)

I am thankful that it is not us who does the choosing!

Consider the circumstances surrounding Pauls conversion: In the 9th chapter of Acts, the Lord spoke to Ananias in a vision and told him to go after Saul of Tarsus. Ananias answered the lord in verse 13 and 14 speaking about Saul of Tarsus:

...Lay Hold on Eternal Life...

"I have heard by many of this man, how much evil he hath done to thy Saints at Jerusalem and here he hath authority from the chief priests to bind all that call on thy name." (Acts 9:13-14)

Ananias, on his own, would most likely not have chosen Paul to do this great work.

I am thankful It is GOD who does the choosing. Think about before you came to the Lord, would you have chosen yourself to do a work for the Lord? It is GOD who does the choosing. Not only so, but He made his choice before the foundation of the world!

We see in all of these things that GOD's choice is a choosing of intention, of a working towards an appointed end,

AND ORDAINED YOU

To ordain in our text means to place. appoint, make, purpose, put, set (forth), to settle.

This word suggests the working out of purpose. God's choosing means something. We are set apart unto a very specific work. Just as we are able to see how these choices of GOD revealed unto us in past events in the scripture lead to an appointed end, we are also being used in that

same way, GOD works in the same way now as he did then because He is the same GOD. He does not change.

The language of scripture constantly points towards GOD's present intentional choosing in redemption. GOD does the choosing, He is the one working these things out for His purpose.

"And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath ENABLED me, for that He counted me faithful, PUTTING me into the ministry "(1 Tim 1:12)/

Paul also testifies in the 12th chapter of his first epistle to the Corinthians of the manner of GOD's choice involved in Christ's work of ordering the church:

"And God hath SET some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues". (1 Cor 12:28)

Peter also speaks of the church in this way:

But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light;

(1 Peter 2:9)

So, why has he chosen us? What is the purpose of these things? That we should go and bring forth fruit.

> "This people have I formed for myself; they shall shew forth my praise". (Isa 43:21)

All of these appointments are unto the glory of GOD, they are set unto the purpose of magnifying his name. You being called into and unto these works is a confirmation to you of the Lords choice.

We are told to examine ourselves to see if we're in the faith, to make your calling and election sure. Not to GOD,

these things, press forward and give haste to the doing of the will of GOD, his spirit testifies to our spirit that we are the sons of GOD, as we are able to perceive the working of GOD in us to glorify him, and increase us we are confident that he that began a good work in us will perform it. Jesus is the author of our faith, and as we continue in it, we can have confidence that he will finish it.

So I encourage you brethren to make your calling an election sure, abide in him and he will abide in you. I exhort you Now go forth and bear fruit YE chosen of GOD.



For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come.

(ICO 11:26)

Why use "bread" to symbolize the body of Christ? We know from the scriptures that our God does not do things "randomly" but everything that He does is with precision and purpose. The same holds true when it comes to this matter. Actually, if you can receive it, God created the whole process whereby bread comes to us in order that we may have a greater understanding of what it meant for Jesus to say "take, eat, this is my body which is broken for you"

Bread is not grown on trees, it is the result of intense labor and there is more than just one step to making bread. Men do not merely plant bread trees and then wait by while they grow! The seeds must be planted, and then after the shoot grows up out of the ground, then, the fruit begins to develop and mature, and when the plant is ready for harvest, the work is just beginning for men! Once the grain is harvested it must be separated from the shaft or stalk, that process is called "threshing" and it is very abusive for the wheat corn. Once this is accomplished it must be "ground", and this process is not something that can be done in a matter of moments. Once the grain is ground into fine flour it must be mixed with other ingredients (water, oil, salt, leaven) to produce the bread. However, the bread at this table is even more specific than that ordinary bread.

Why has the Lord taught us a lot about the preparation bread? Because Jesus was going to one day pick up the bread, break it and say "take, eat, this is my body which is broken for you." The bread that was used in the service of the Lord was of a very specific recipe, it was to have no "leaven" used in it. We know that leaven is put into bread to cause it to "rise". This process takes a little bit of dough and causes it to appear to be much larger.

When you take a piece of leavened bread into your hands it may look like a lot of bread, but if you compare it to the unleavened equivalent, it would be surprisingly little. God began teaching us about this type of bread early on, it was this kind of bread that Lot fed to the "special men" (Angels) that had come to inspect the land of Sodom (Gen 19:3) – God also told Moses to instruct the children of Israel on the night of the Passover, to make unleavened bread, and with bitter herbs they were to eat it! This type of bread had no add mixture, it did not misrepresent itself, and it did not appear to be one thing, when in reality it was something else.

There was another kind of bread that was very unique for the children of Israel, and the Lord himself gave them the ingredient from which their bread was to be made, it was called "manna" and it was all they ate for forty years! – Later it would be called "Angels' food" or "corn from heaven" by David (Psm 78:24,25) – Later, when Jesus was in a boat with His disciples he brought up this concept of leaven when He said "... Take heed and beware of the leaven of the Pharisees and of the Sadducees." (Matthew

16:6) There is always danger to be found in men pretending to be one thing, when they are really something else. So we can see that leaven is not just something that is put in bread! Jesus is teaching us that just as leaven makes the bread to "rise" and become larger than what it really is, the "leaven" (or teaching) of the Pharisees can alter the truth by adding things (customs of men) to it, and in the end, because of that admixture, the truth is compromised in them.

In other words, when men take the word of the gospel and mix in with it the requirements of man, they have in fact neutered it of the power that God has placed in the gospel. When men lead people at this table to think about "other things" than what God has accomplished in the death of Christ, they have robbed men of the blessing.

Why did God go to so much trouble to instruct the human race concerning which "type" of bread he would receive? Because Jesus was going to use this type of bread to one day illustrate something about salvation.

Jesus is directing our minds to consider some things that are hidden to the mind of the flesh. On the night He was betrayed, while they were observing the Passover dinner, Jesus takes the bread, the unleavened bread, and He breaks it and says "take, eat, this is my body which is broken for you" by doing this He is revealing the "behind the scenes" nature of what the cost of salvation would be, He is speaking in connection to "His body" and the bread (1 Pet 2:24) - these two elements are now forever connected, when we come around the table we are to also make this very profound connection. Just as bread is grown from a seed, Jesus was required to be born and raised up from a child, He would have to "grow up among them as a tender plant" (Isa 53:2) and just as the grain is harvested from the shaft, through much threshing, the corn is actually bruised in the process, (Isa 28:28) Jesus would have to endure much threshing or bruising from His Father, as He bears the sin of the world. (Isa 53:5) The Prophet Isaiah was given to speak of this time in which God would pour out His wrath and indignation against sin (Isa 53:5) - God would "lay on Him" the iniquity of us all, (Isa 53:6) and Christ would survive to rise from the grave on the third day. (Isa 54:8)(Acts2: 31)

Just as we eat bread to sustain our life here in the flesh we also need "eat", "imbibe" or take in Christ, we are not able to sustain our lives for a single moment! The breath that we presently enjoy is a gift from our God and if we are to receive another, it is because of the Lord's great mercy towards the sons of men. "For he remembered that they were but flesh; a wind that passeth away, and cometh not again." (Psalm 78:39)

When we gather at this "table of remembrance" the focus is not on us, even though the ones doing the remembrance are the ones who are being blessed, but the blessing comes from fellowshipping with the one who bore our sin away from the presence of God - Jesus is using this time spent around his table to bring us closer to His Father! -We must not allow for diversions at this time, the Apostle Paul warns us that there were some at Corinth that God killed because they did not "discern" the Lord's body (1 Cor 11:29) This should not cause anyone who is walking by faith to draw back from gathering at this table, but it should produce an environment of sober mindedness. This time is not for the silly, nor for the lighthearted. We must see what is really going on, behind the seen, at this table. God is here, Christ is administering at this time, and the Holy Spirit is making the application to our hearts. This is not a time for men to attempt to correct other men, NO, this is the Lord's Table! The Apostle Paul leads us in the proper approach when he says "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are all partakers of that one bread.' (1 Corinthians 10:16-17) We have come together, as they did, to "commune with Christ" as we consider Him - He will then transfer the relevance of salvation to all the vast members of the body, fitting them together in love, strengthening them together for the day when the whole body, both in heaven, and on the earth" will be made "one with God", even as the Father, Son and Spirit are now.

Bread! - Only God could create something so sublime as this! To create our bodies with the need eat, in order to show us the deeper reality of needing to have His life in us if we are to live unto Him.

THE REASON FOR THE STRUGGLE Part 6 of a series entitled "Inner Conflict and It's Remedy" By: Brother Given O. Blakely.

Faith brings the capacity for reciprocity with heaven. This is described in various ways in Scripture. It is being "called unto the fellowship of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord" (1 Cor. 1:9). It is also referred to as "the communion of the Holy Spirit" (2 Cor. 13:14), and being "joined to the Lord" (1 Cor. 6:17). This is "eternal life," which consists of the spiritual knowledge of "the only true God, and Jesus Christ" Whom He has sent (John 17:3; 1 John 5:20).

NEW LIFE INTRODUCED

The introduction of this new life is glorious. We have become "partakers of the Divine nature" (2 Pet. 1:4), as well as "partakers of Christ" (Heb. 3:14). God has "sent forth the Spirit of His Son into our hearts" (Gal. 4:6), as a pledge of future glory. Our personal involvement in the process is set forth in the new covenant promise, "I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them" (Heb. 10:16). This describes a very real inclination toward, and preference for, the will of God. The absence of this in much of the religion of our day is cause for great alarm.

From within, "the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit which is given unto us" (Rom. 5:5). Thus are we empowered to love God with all of the heart, soul, mind, and strength, fulfilling the law of God (Matt. 22:37).

This inward work results in the possession of a "sound mind," capable of distinguishing both good and evil (2 Tim. 1:7).

The new birth is not a metaphor, as some would have us believe. An actual transformation has taken place. We have been united with Christ, and are now indwelt by Deity (John 14:34; Rom. 8:9,11; 2 Cor 6:16; Eph. 2:17). However, our rebirth did not eradicate the old nature. It will remain with us until we are "absent from the body" (2 Cor. 5:6-9). "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" (2 Cor. 5:17).

This does not mean that the old nature has passed away--it has not! The capacity to sin remains with us. The person in Christ still is tempted, "drawn away of his own lust, and enticed" (James 1:14). Old things "have passed away" in that they are no longer loved and preferred. We are being oriented for heaven, where "no unclean thing" can enter (Eph. 5:5). From this perspective, conflict within may be viewed from two perspectives. First, Satan is attempting to remove our appetite for spiritual things, and increase our appetite for the passing things of this world. Second, the Holy Spirit is culturing an penchant for things that are eternal. This will allow us to make the transition to glory without any trauma.

... Lay Hold on Eternal Life ...

God does not intend our induction into eternity to be abrasive. "All things" have become "new" due to spiritual perspective and appetite.

We are looking for "new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness" (2 Pet. 3:13-14). That prospect has made everything "new."

Yet, while we occupy the realm of sense and time, proclivities to evil remain in us. We are not content with this condition. Its presence accounts for all of our setbacks, shortcoming, and insensitivities.

The reason for the struggle is the introduction of heavenly life! As soon as the "new" came, the first was made "old." This is the principle revealed in the old and new covenants (Heb. 8:13). It is not only true of the covenants, it is also true of man's nature. Our Adamic nature become "old" when we "received" Christ (John 1:12) and the "Spirit of adoption" (Rom. 8:15). At this point, the conflict began! The Divine life, now in "the sons of God" (1 John 3:1) requires the crucifixion of "that which is born of flesh" (John 3:6). Though crucified, however, the "flesh" remains adamant and expressive, like the impenitent thief with whom Jesus was crucified (Luke 23:29). Unlike the penitent thief, however, the flesh cannot and will not change (Luke 23:40-42).

CONTRASTING VIEWS

Conflicting principles are now found within us. We have a "heavenly treasure" in an "earthly vessel" (2 Cor. 4:7). In that condition, it is not possible to be without the experience of fierce inner conflict and contradiction. That situation is the source of contradictory feelings, thoughts, and inclinations. Our "earthen vessel" struggles for dominance, and in its conflict with the "treasure" we have our warfare. The "treasure," like Abraham, is found in strange and hostile environment (Heb. 11:19).

Both "light" and "darkness" exist in us. The presence of these moral influences requires diligent effort to "walk as children of light" (Eph. 5:8). Light has no "communion" with

darkness (2 Cor. 6:14). No place is this lack of communion as evident as it is within the believer. It becomes the source of incessant struggle.


Good and evil wrestle within the reconciled, struggling for the dominance (Rom. 7:15-23; 1 Cor. 15:33). The influence of one of these cannot be experienced without the influence of the other. Good cannot be pursued without evil crying for attention, and evil cannot become the focus of attention without good objecting. Two contrary voices cry simultaneously, demanding our allegiance.

"The Spirit" and the "flesh" have mutually antithetic desires, and make them known within the redeemed (Gal. 5:17). They "lust" against each other, pulling in opposite directions. Their contrariety is the cause oif nner struggle and con flict.

The eternal and the temporal orders cry out for the attention of the saints. The sobering reality is that believers have the ability to behold them both (2 Cor. 4:18). This condition requires spiritual vigilance and diligence in the child of God. It is not possible to be passive or casual in this struggle, and still be found "accepted of Him" (2 Cor. 5:9). The presence of warring principles creates a "valley of decision" (Joel 3:14).

There are an "old" and a "new" man within the saved. The "old" is to be subordinated and "put off" by the believer, and the "new" is to be "put on" (Eph. 4:22-24). This cannot be accomplished without hearty effort on the part of the believer. Neither will it be achieved is assemblies of believers do not contribute to their spiritual strength. The casual sharing of general information and news items will never give the saints an advantage in their warfare. Intellectual treatise of interesting subjects, historical analysis, and humorous anecdotes will not do it either. Leaders that take the warfare seriously will fed the flock. Those that do not should be discharged immediately, and without question. Eternal issues are at stake!

A struggle between life and death rages in everyone that has believed and obeyed the Gospel. It is something in which you are involved. It has to do with eternal life and condemnation, and it was initiated by the introduction of spiritual life.



There are certain admonitions that can only be given to those who are walking according to the Spirit of God.

Php 2:5 - Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

Col 3:15 - And **Let** the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.

Col 3:16 - Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom

2 Co 7:1 -.... **let** us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of GOD.

All of these type of exhortations from the apostle Paul appealed to the readers connection with Jesus. He gave these words to them with their new life in mind. These are words which men who are living according to their own lusts cannot even receive, let alone fulfill. They draw attention to, and stimulate, the ability of the spirit of GOD to motivate and empower men to walk in, and according to, the new life they have been given in Christ. These things are unto us a good example of what gainful communication looks like between the people of GOD.

I was blessed in considering this word 'let'. The most common usage involves allowing, permitting, or submitting. It assumes that the one doing the letting has the liberty to do so. It is also used to mean; 'To grant the occupancy or use of'. What these exhortations are saying is this; submit yourself to the Spirit in the working out of the salvation into which you have been put. Let Him have his way in you, don't allow anything to frustrate His intention to do His good pleasure in you, allow your vessel, your house, so to speak be 'let' by the Spirit.

THERE IS NO "SUBLETTING" ALLOWED IN CHRIST

When we meet together with other believers, it is profitable and appropriate for us to appeal to our brethren in this way as well. We recognize the liabilities that are involved with remaining in the flesh, and having the influence of the old man within us. However, as it concerns our emphasis, the thing we focus upon, it is best to speak with the ability of the Spirit that has been placed within us in mind. Don't emphasize things which do not require a new nature to engage in. Likewise, do not speak words that assume rebellion, bad motives, and skewed desires. Rather, speak words that address one who is believing, one who wants to do the right thing, one who has good desires Godward, and good affection toward the brethren. Craft words that are designed to stimulate, or provoke your brethren to more fully engage in the kingdom.

Heb 10:24 - And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works


On a personal level, strive to live in a manner that will provide for holy provocation. Edification in its very nature carries with it the idea of building. Something which had been edified becomes an edifice, a building, a tower. When you think of a tower, you don't think of a very strong stack of single bricks, you think of many crafted, strategically placed bricks.

I exhort you then, reader, to Let GOD have his way in you. Strive always to more fully and completely be given over to the will of GOD being performed in you, and may we all continue in this good work, to intentionally strive to speak and act towards one another in a manner that would cause our brethren to be moved towards a more lively, intentional involvement in pressing forward in kingdom labors.

GAKE IG BY FORCE!

"And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force."

Matthew 11:12 ... "The law and the prophets were until John: since that time the kingdom of God is preached, and every man presseth into it." Luke 16:16

These words are a puzzle to people with passing or superficial knowledge of Biblical content. The prevailing view of Jesus is that He was and is a passive man of non-aggressive words and behavior. Yet, in these words on both occasions, Jesus stated a primary aspect of God's Kingdom, throughout its revelatory history. Heaven has an aggressive agenda that moves forward, ever forward, without regard to human feelings or interests. Consider the revelation of God's decision to Noah of destroying the whole human race. Also, God bringing the famine in the days of Joseph or His demand that Egypt release the Hebrew slaves or else! These slaves were the strength of Egypt's economy. What would they do without their slave laborers? Still, according to God's promise to Abraham in Genesis 15, Israel came out of Egypt by force!

So, Jesus' words, in our focus text, are spoken in the midst of religious conflict. In Matthew's text Jesus comments on John the Baptist's ministry as He answered a question sent, by John, through two disciples. The question let Jesus affirm His stunning public ministry, especially the works of wonder which fulfilled Scripture. The old english word 'suffereth' means 'allows.' So, there is a provision for spiritual violence as we see in John and Jesus' ministry in Israel. In the other text, from Luke's record, Jesus dealt with objections from His ever present opponents, the scribes and Pharisees. They ridiculed His teaching about earthly riches and kingdom riches. His words affirmed God's values contrasted with men's. And His words were aggressive not a suggestion or the basis for discussion by academics. He revealed that God loves certain things and despises others!

God Almighty works at a purpose and agenda by which He fulfills that purpose in heaven and on earth. The temporal earth is part of God's agenda, yet, His purpose is eternal. It is work in which God has always and will always be busy. His wisdom, power, and attention are always set on this purpose and the agenda by which He fulfills it. He never falters, retreats, or is thrown off track by anything in heaven or on earth. Nothing is able to detour Him or surprises Him. Jesus demonstrated this in His earthly ministry. He led the way and everyone had to run just to keep up. Many times the disciples awoke from a nights sleep and Jesus was already up praying and prepared to engage the day. Remember when they stopped at Sychar to get food. Jesus still worked, even as He rested by the well. He revealed Himself to the Samaritan woman.

The point is that God's kingdom is aggressive and determined as it unfolds from the Father's wisdom. Jesus went about doing good so much so that a detailed record of these things could not be made. "... If they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written." John 21:25. His enemies tried everything to debate and object to His words and deeds. Yet, He just moved forward after cutting them off!

Remember a Galilean synagogue one Sabbath. "And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up herself. And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, 'Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity.' And he laid his hands on her: and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. And the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because that Jesus had healed on the sabbath day, and said unto the people, 'There are six days in which men ought to work: in them therefore come and be healed, and not on the sabbath day." The Lord then answered him, and said, 'Thou hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the sabbath loose his ox or his ass from the stall, and lead him away to watering? And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?' And when he had said these things, all his adversaries were ashamed: and all the people rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by him."

Luke 13:11-17

Such was the nature of Jesus' public ministry which revealed and affirmed His identity. He simply rolled over and crushed opposition, including demons who tormented and destroyed people. These included... a man in a Capernaum synagogue, Mary Madalene, the young man brought to Jesus by his father, the daughter of the gentile woman, and the man with 'Legion' in him.

All abused by these wicked spiritual powers which Jesus simply drove out, forced them to release their victims. This was the beginning of Jesus tying the 'strongman' spoiling his houseand taking his possessions, **Matthew 12:29!** He pressed the enemy with violence and brought the kingdom of heaven to bear against Satan and his works. Also, two times Jesus took control of the Temple area and removed the marketplace, **John 2:14; Matthew 21:12.**

When Jesus encountered anyone or anything that pressed its will against God's will, He just removed it by word or deed. He had spiritual power and He used it for the glory of God and the benefit of those who suffered from the ravages of disease, demons, or men who knew not the truth. Christ also used divine power against a storm on the Sea of Galilee, *Mark 4:39*. And to feed hungry people, hunger is violent and presses people, however Jesus has power to change the course of its violence. *Matthew* 14:16!

Later the apostles pressed into the ministry work Jesus gave them when He returned to the Father. They preached and filled the city of Jerusalem with the message of His resurrection and ascension, even after the elders and chief priests commanded them to stop. They obeyed God rather than men now that they understood what they had not seen when Jesus was with them. That understanding came by God's Spirit in them and is the violent nature of this kingdom into which Jesus calls believers. His disciples now had insight into its working and they got to work along with the purpose of God in and through Christ Jesus who was in them!

They eventually passed from the city of Jerusalem into the countryside, other cities, and across the Roman empire with the message that God fulfilled His promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

They went to synagogues in every city they entered and delivered the message of goodness and power in Jesus of Nazareth, His beloved Son! Many Jews opposed them as did gentiles. GROWTH IN SPEAKING

I can preach and minister to the saints now, but this was not always the case. There was a time when I could hardly speak on anything at all. "...That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ..." (Ephesians 4:14-15)

GROWTH IN ENDURANCE

Starting out in the faith, you may not feel very strong, and it may not take much to press you down and cry out for help. However, with growth comes an increase in strength.

There may have been things that really agitated and distracted you, but growing up will help you not to be constantly troubled. Consider the athlete working out in the gym. He spends his time there running and lifting weights with the intent of getting faster and stronger. He may lift the same weight each time he is there, but soon enough, that weight feels much lighter than before, and now he is able to increase that weight. He may tire easily at first when running, but soon enough, he is able to run for long periods of time without losing his breath. Is it not the same way in the Kingdom of God? The Lord does not put on us more than we can bear, but think about that. How much can you currently bear? You can look at your current state and see how much you have grown. The trials you have passed through recently, were you able to pass through such things before? Any infirmities you may have to live with, could you live with such things before? Things that troubled you in the past, do those things trouble you now? In all these things, we are seeing that God is making us stronger as we continue in the faith.

We are able to fight the good fight with more aggression. We can stand fast and endure fiercer opposition. We can maintain a firmer grasp on spiritual things. The trial of our faith is not a strange thing, rather it can be a means to know where you are in the faith. Each trial you pass through tells you something about the status of your faith. If you have passed through fiercer trials, it is because you have grown!

"That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honor and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 1:7)

ALL TRACED BACK TO OUR PERCEPTION OF JESUS

While growth is always an encouraging thing we detected, we must understand the source of all growth in spiritual things. All of these areas of growth are traced back to our perception of the savior, the man Christ Jesus. How well do you know Him? How much can you say about Him?

How much are you willing to suffer for His names sake? If we desire to grow, we must focus our full attention on the one died for us. He is the author and finisher of our faith. It is Him that the scriptures testify of. He is the one who increases our faith. He is the head of the body. To whom else should we go brethren?

When we say we are growing, we are growing up IN HIM. His words "Without me you can do nothing" remains true today.

This includes spiritual growth in the Kingdom of God. Without Jesus, you will get nowhere and will only wither.

So, I encourage you to abide with Jesus, because with Him growth is inevitable. Never be content with how much you know Him. Get closer! Never feel like you have exhausted what can be known about Him with your words. Add to what you say! Never feel like you have suffered enough for Him. Keep carrying your cross! Growth in Christ is worth it, and if you continue in Him you will see that for yourself. Growing up in Christ will have a tremendous impact on your understanding, ability to speak the truth, endurance, and even your confidence in the Lord. One of the best thing about it is that this doesn't have to take a long time. You don't have to wait years and years to see the results I mentioned above. At the same time, there is still plenty of room for growth even if you have been in Christ a long time. Jesus doesn't give slow motion increase, rather He causes us to grow rapidly and exceedingly. If you are not happy with where you are in your understanding, go to Jesus! If you feel you have a firm grasp on the truth, go to Jesus! He will always have something to give you when you come to Him.

"But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our-Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 3:18)

Concerning the responsibilty of being freed from sin ..

Jesus is able to forgive sin because He "took all sin away" while He suffered the wrath of God on the cross. He did this in order that those who have had their sins removed would live free from the defiling influence of sin, and live unto God!

When we come to realize that we have been called to "crucify our flesh" (Gal 5:24) and "die with Christ" (Rom 6:8) in order that we might serve God acceptably, then any sin, no matter the size, becomes unacceptable. If Christ had to be put to death for our sin, so we could come to God, then let us beat a path (as it were) into the throne of all grace and enjoy the eternal first fruits of salvation that will sustain us until we are "fully satiated" with His presence forevermore!

Eph 2:21: In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord:

This is intriguing language in this text. " all the building.....groweth."

In the world, there is no example of this type of thing. These two are contrary to one another.

Buildings are constructed to be unchanging, immovable edifices. There is no expectation of growth, in fact, they are built purposely to prevent something happening to the building that would change it's construction.

In contrast to this, plants are not built, they are grown. In the case of the plant, there is a very real expectation of a growing up. There is provision made to facilitate that growth.

Buildings are made of inanimate objects, materials, impersonal and generic. When constructing his project, the builder considers not the personality of the wood out of which he makes the frame of the house. He does not know the name of each plank, he does not fellowship with each nail which fastens them together. And, likewise, the materials have no relation, except at the point at which they contact one another in the interest of holding up the structure.

Again, on the contrary, plants are made of living cells. When growing up the plant, the husbandman considers the nature of the plant and its needs. He knows the characteristics of its type, and what needs to be provided for its growth. The different parts of the plant have an intimate connection with each other, and rely upon one another to nourish and feed the entire planting.

Yet, in this divine building project, we read here of a structure that is growing up. A building and yet also, a planting. It is not a work of something which is merely constructed, yet it is not a result of natural organic growth. It is designed, controlled, facilitated, built, and yet it grows, increases, flowers and brings forth fruit.

This is a marvel of divine engineering and a unique expression of eternal life in a created being. God working out salvation in you, and yet you working out your own salvation. Jesus building his church, and yet the church submitting to the leading of, and following in the footsteps, of their king.

This truly is the demonstration, and fulfillment of the mystery, Christ in you, the hope of glory.

Let us rejoice in, and submit ourselves to, this building and remain planted in this place in which we shall grow and increase!
