

ENDEAVORING TO KEEP

I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; (Eph 4:1-4)

The apostle here speaks these words to a "church" - a body of people in a certain region who have been drawn by the Lord to one another to have fellowship in the Truth. He does not admonish them to create peace, or fabricate unity. Rather, he appeals to the unity which already exists naturally between the sons of God, to continue in the unity which has already been given unto them as brothers in Christ as members of a whole host of brethren which includes members over the entire earth, and even in heavenly places. He is essentially calling those in this church he is wiriting to, as followers of Jesus to, in their dealings with one another, follow after the Prince ofpeace,

I think this is an endeavor which, if we are not mindful of it, can be neglected. Although unity is natural in the Spirit, just as one must constantly employ their faith in believing, continually fan the fires of hope, continually have their pure minds stirred up by way of remembrance, and the spirit must be continually walked in and according to, unity must continually be kept, the bond of peace must remain a bond - it must be held together. Just as all of these other things will not happen by accident, this unity and peace we have been blessed with in Chirst will not be kept without considerable effort.

I have been recently stirred in this matter by my negligence in failing to labor enough in this endeavor. I repent of that before God and men. This revelation to my heart, mind, and spirit has stirred and provoked me to seek grace to be more faithful in this endeavor. Is this beneficial? Is this really the truth? Or do I just feel like saying this because I want to voice my opinion? I think anyone who is honest and truly desires to labor in this endeavour will come to the right conclusion if they thoroughly examine the spirit and motivation of their words in accord with this standard. *"Let all things be done to the use of edifying"*

I encourage all in Christ to be sensitive to not offend, yet also endeavor to not be easily offended. Don't be quick to assign ignoble motives when there may have just been a miscommunication. THOUGHTS ON FIGHTING THE GOOD FIGHT

There will be situations you will encounter in life that appear on the surface to be hopeless. They will appear to contradict what God is doing in delivering saints on the Earth. Today, you may experience the following:

Hunger, heat, cold, inadequate clothing, sadness, sickness and disease, tiredness, pain, perils in commuting, persecution and hatred, being forsaken of men, injustices, over encumbering tasks and burdensome labor, death and injury of loved ones, the cares of the world, sinful environments that vex your soul, distractions, and various other fiery trials and temptations. On paper it's easy to boil these down to a mere intellectual assessment, but to experience them for yourself is quite another thing altogether.

For instance, it's one thing to say to a person who has lost their child to trust God, and it's another thing to experience your child dying and having to trust Him yourself. Regardless of what we pass through all of these things are purposely designed and sent by God to produce things in you. (1 Pet 1:7) These things are produced in us when we, in the experience, lean the weight of our souls on God, trusting in Him. We pass through, trusting in the Savior's words, "...be not afraid, only believe" (Mk 5:36). Focusing on what you're going through will cause you to be afraid — Believing Jesus will cause you to pass through!

Just like Peter began to sink when he turned his attention from Jesus and onto the storm *(Matt 14:30)*, If at any time your attention turns to what you are going through, you will begin to sink. You see, all of these experiences generate thoughts within every one of us.

All thoughts are like roads. They lead a person places. Some thoughts, if entertained, can lead you away from the light, distract you from doing the works of God, and give place to the devil. If followed long enough they lead to other evil thoughts, imaginations, erroneous conclusions, unthankfulness, doubt, unbelief, and they can eventually cause these things to enter your heart! It is a sobering truth, that a person who errors in their conduct, first errors in their thinking. This is why we are admonished to ,"set our affection on things above." (Col 3:2), and to "....bring into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Cor 10:5). To "cast your care upon Him" (1 Pet 5:7). To "Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God." (Heb 3:12). These are realities we must be aware of at all times.

Remember what Peter did during the time he began to sink, He called out to Jesus to save Him, believing He could (*Matt 14:30*). As we set our attention on the things of God there are Holy thoughts generated that lead us to beautiful and fruitful places. Places on High that nurture faith and hope. As we are built up in our most Holy faith, we will find that impossible situations are not so. You will be able to pass through things that even defy nature— like walking on the water during a storm, you can endure persecution, temptation, injustice and more. If anything stands in your way, you will be able to conquer it! Giants or not!

But Peter walked with Jesus. He was aquainted with Him so much so that He knew to call out to Him when He needed help. Our relationship with Chirst is no different. When the storms of doubt, trial, and temptations come our way, we need to already be intimately acquainted with Jesus, so that we will know to call out to Him. Closeness to God gives the believer a constraining zeal to follow after righteousness, and to not want to sin. Why would a person resist a temptation if they did not want to resist it? How can a person call out for help when they do not want it? Nearness to God will cause you to reach out to Him and take the way of escape.

This is also why it is important to culture Godly friendships in the world, and not to be intermingling unnecessarily with those who are unbelievers. They are not afraid to speak what they think, even things that ought not be spoken, so not only are you having to do battle with your own contrary thoughts during your time of trial, but with the thoughts and suggestions of others during your trial. On the other hand, those who are fighting the good fight can share with us Holy and precious thoughts! They can encourage and build us up and strengthen our hands!

So when the 10 spies give an evil report, do not judge according to appearances, but with a righteous judgment! God said He would deliver us, and He will! Today, fight the good fight of faith! Wrestle to stay focused on God! Everyone who fights wins, regardless of the giants they may face!

After Paul wrote his first letter to the Thessalonians, he became aware that false teachers in the church were perverting the Truth of the gospel He and Silas had taught, misleading believers with erroneous ideas that the day of the Lord was already come. Some thought the "day of Christ is at hand" (2 Thess 2:2), some thinking it so near that it was as good as present, and believing that was why they were experiencing tribulation.

Paul perceived the immediate spiritual danger to the church and wrote his second letter, restating the Truth and the facts revealed to him concerning the events of Christ's return, explaining the jeopardy of the church's condition. Paul would later write to the Ephesian church about a similar problem of believers failing to grow in their faith and thereby becoming prey to false teaching: "That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive" (Eph 4:13).

Paul determined it was his responsibility to reestablish the Truth, as Christ "cometh to judge the earth: he shall judge the world with righteousness, and the people with his truth" (Psa 96:13). It was necessary that Paul correct the deceptions that had crept in to the church, and encourage them in their faith. He's wise to address the whole church in a spirit of unity as "whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it...." (1 Cor 12:26), first explaining the meaning of suffering - which is righteous judgment (2 Thess 1:5), and is not a sign that the day of the Lord is come. What believers in the church had heard from others was wrong. The Holy Spirit's manner of dealing with this crisis of faith was to speak through Paul the truth and then give the meaning. He discerned deceit had been allowed to intrude into the minds of the believers, purposing to weaken their faith – exactly how Satan operates.

Suffering aims ultimately not at men's harm, but at his holiness and Paul reminds them that it is by this suffering they are "counted worthy of the kingdom of God" (v1.5); Faith enables us to tolerate suffering and to walk through it by God's strength;

He also reminds them that those who are afflicting will become the afflicted at the Lord's second coming – the Lord "recompenses tribulation to them that trouble you" (v1.6); evil will neither prosper nor prevail;

Yet, believers who are being afflicted will be given rest at the coming of the Lord; the Lord will recompense "to you who are troubled rest with us" (v1.7); here, referring to an end of their troubles and persecution, a rest that is ours because we have believed and which the saints will receive in fulness at the Lord's coming.

Brethren, Jesus Christ "is leading many sons to glory", and it pleased the Father to "....make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings". He also is gloriously perfecting us in like manner. Paul wrote Timothy that God will reward our faith and patience: "If we suffer, we shall also reign with him" (2 Tim 2:12), and he was well able to expound on these things as he himself must suffer in the earth with a thorn in his side, so that he could truthfully testify and witness to the words spoken to him by the Lord:

...Lay Hold on Eternal Life...

....My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness", and glorify God. Paul gladly bore and glorified in his infirmities "that the power of Christ may rest upon me" (2 Cor 12:9), and witnessed to the Galatians: "From henceforth let no man trouble me: for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus." (Gal 6:17). Peter said of this provision "But and if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, happy are ye" (1 Pet 3:14), and we also can testify that in our trials we have experienced the power of Christ resting on us.

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And we are fully persuaded this is not because Christ is come, it is because Christ will come!

We're exhorted to remain stable, watchful, and alert that we would be prepared for the Lord's return, to "be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled" as were the Thessalonians, as if the day of Christ were already here (2 Thess 2:2). The saints are reminded Christ can come in judgment at any time, so "....be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer" (1 Pet 4:7), and "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith" (1

Cor 16:13); and "Therefore let us not sleep, as do others; but let us watch and be sober" (1 Thess 5:6), putting on "....the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil" (Eph 6:11).

On the Mount of Olives when Jesus' disciples questioned Jesus about his return, His very first response was "Take heed that no man deceive you" (Matt 24:4); Peter wrote "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour" (1 Pet 5:8); the Hebrews writer tells us "Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip." (Heb 2:1); and Paul told the Romans "Now I beseech you, brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them." (Rom 16:17).

It takes all men's faith, God's strength by grace, and the love of the truth to remain wholly vigilant and repel the wicked one's advances.

The enemy's very present and forceful attempts to turn the saints away from the Lord through the reality of false teaching is the greatest threat of all to the faithful believer. The saints' capacity to oppose and neutralize it and be ready for Christ when He comes is a matter of life and death. And this we see expounded in second Thessalonians. Jesus gave many warnings: "Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves." (Matt 7:15), "For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect." (Matt 24:24), and Peter wrote "But there

were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you....And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of" (2 Pet 2:1-2).

It takes all men's faith, God's strength by grace, and the love of the truth to remain wholly vigilant and repel the wicked one's advances. After the walls of Jerusalem had been rebuilt,

and Sanballat, Tobiah, Arabians, Ammonites and Ashdodites - very wroth - surrounded the city looking to forcibly enter, the people "made our prayer unto our God and set a watch against them day and night" (Neh 4:9). Brethren this is timely advice.

Paul again reminds the Thessalonians (he has taught them before) of the manner of our Lord's return: "....the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power; When he shall come to be glorified in his saints...." (2 Thess 1:7-10).

Before this, however, there will be an apostasy in the earth - a falling away, a defection of men from the faith, an act of unpardonable rebellion against God and his Truth. There will be a famine of hearing wherein the Word of God, though available will not be heard: "Behold, the days come, saith the Lord God, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord; And they shall wander from sea to sea, and from the north even to the east, they shall run to and fro to seek the word of the Lord, and shall not find it" (Amos 8:11-12). Then the man of lawlessness – Antichrist, the son of perdition - will be revealed on earth.

Satan's evil and deception are already at work in the world, and many anti-Christ's: John wrote "Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time" (1 John 2:18). That man of sin's appearance is presently being restrained, by whom or why, we are not told, but God will allow him to be revealed at an appointed time and then he will stand in the temple of God and declare himself to be God, opposing any other, and exalting himself above the one true God. He will come with evil power and with fake signs and pretend miracles to promote his lies, but Christ will consume him "with the spirit of His mouth", and destroy him "with the brightness of his coming" (2 Thess 2:8).

He will come "....with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness." (2 Thess 2:10-12)

The man of sin works by innate deceit and falsehood, and will by means of such trickery and misrepresentation, masquerade his unrighteousness as righteousness, his wickedness as holiness to impose upon the world. Though all will be exposed to Antichrist's deceptions, those "that perish" are in the greatest jeopardy. Such are those that did not care for the truth, whom when given it rejected it, preferring darkness over light, to whom "....the preaching of the cross is foolishness" (1 Cor 1:18), to whom the gospel "is hid", "in whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not" (2 Cor 4:3-4); whom God has given up "to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts" (Rom 1:24); they received not the love of the Truth, and preferred unright-eousness.

God responded to their continuing sin by bringing upon them strong delusion (no longer just an indifference to the Truth, but an effectual influence of error upon their hearts) with the deliberate purpose that they are now unable to discern between truth and a lie. Paul later wrote similarly to the Romans of God's retribution and wrath against the unrighteous and ungodly who had changed the truth of God into a lie: "....For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections" (Rom 1:24, 26). When Antichrist comes, such will neither recognize the reality of his deceptions, nor be able to escape receiving Satan's lie which Antichrist would have them believe, succumbing totally to his seductions and falsehoods unto condemnation. Jesus knew this would happen: "I am come in my Father's name, and ye receive me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive" (John 5:43). They will do so because they have not received the love of the Truth - a gift from God to all men - and will not be saved from condemnation; they have forfeited God's salvation that He had purposed for all men.

The burden on God of Israel's sin caused Him to tell the Israelites "Behold, I am pressed under you, as a cart is pressed that is full of sheaves." (Amos 2:13). How much more the burden on God, of all the sin in the world? This burden He purposed to have gloriously lifted through the work of His Son Jesus Christ whom God sent that all should "believe on him whom he hath sent" (John 6:29).

We are not to think that this is ultimately for our sakes - it is ultimately for God's sake. Who among us is so ignorant and vain to refuse the love of the Truth of a mighty God, of whom, Isaiah wrote "....hath measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, and meted out heaven with the span, and comprehended the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales, and the hills in a balance" (Isa 40:12)? God was pleased for a season to overlook the times of human ignorance of his Deity, omnipotence and His will, and His people failing to love Him, but not anymore since He gave His Son to save the world. He is not going to wink any longer at unrighteousness, and men not receiving His Christ and His gift of the love of the Truth. As it is written: "And the times of this ignorance God winked at; but now commandeth all men every where to repent" (Acts17:30).

...Lay Hold on Eternal Life...

LOVE OF THE TRUTH

If men do not have the love of the Truth, it is impossible for such to bring honor and glory to God's name. As the Truth is His gift to men who have a choice to reject it, or believe it, so the love of the Truth is His gift and men must receive it or be forever lost. God thus requires men to not just assent to His Truth, but to love it, and if we do not have the love of the Truth and do not pursue it, we cannot have a saving relationship with God.

We may be zealous for God and purpose to learn and know as much as we possibly can about Him as in an intellectual search for Him in the books of Moses and the prophets (as the Jews purposed to do), yet not know in our hearts, God or His ways, or His will, or His righteousness, or His salvation. Paul said of the Jews, praying that they might be saved: "For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge." (Rom 10:2). Such do not know God in the manner of knowing Him with a heart's love for Him. Diligent study of the scriptures may teach a man about God and Christ, but he will not know either, unless he has the love of the Truth. Fleshly affections for the truths in the gospel, knowledge of and even compliance with the scriptures, as of laws, or historical faith in the doctrines but denying the power thereof, are not evidences of the love of the Truth.

In order for men to love the Truth it must, in his heart be preferred and esteemed highly above all else, recognizing its value is higher than any other thing in his temporal life; it is not to be given up for any purpose, for any thing; it is written "Buy the truth, and sell it not " (Prov 23:23), and we would be willing to sell all to obtain it "....the kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field." (Matt 13:44).

The love of the Truth parallels our love for Jesus Christ, as He is "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Our love of Jesus embodies the love of the Truth. The two cannot be separated in the sincere heart. If we do not have the love of the Truth, we cannot profess to love Jesus. If we do not love Jesus, the love of the Truth has no meaning. A love of the Truth means we have an heart attitude which values the Truth for its own sake – even for Christ's sake. That is, we love the Truth not because it is our only source of Truth, speaks the Truth, or instructs us in the ways of Truth and righteousness, but because it is the Truth. We love the Truth in such a manner that our heart is compelled to desire more of it – to plumb its depths as deeply as our heart will allow, and by grace and through the Holy Spirit we do receive even greater capacity to love and know the Truth and Christ, and by it, an increase in our love for the Truth until its end is reached when we see God. The Truth must be our "first love", and we would forfeit all else to put it and Christ first in our affections, resisting attempts by Satan who would have us to place our greatest love in things of the earth.

Paul's expression of the infinite value, and ultimate saving power unto all men of Christ's sufferings and resurrection, I believe demonstrates to us the meaning and the glory of the love of the Truth: "Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ, And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith: That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death; If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead" (Phil 3:8-11). And this too is our heart's highest desire.

For him who has not the love of the Truth, the window of time for him to receive it is still open, but it closeth. Paul said "The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light" (Rom 13:12).

The good news is that those who have received Jesus Christ and the love of the Truth from God by the Holy Spirit, and follow in His ways – not perishing – are saved; saved from the assaults of lies from anti-Christ's and the lawless one; saved from being wholly deceived; saved from receiving the curse of delusion; saved from perishing; saved from condemnation.

This Truth that we love is that which was revealed to us and given to us in Jesus Christ by whom all grace and Truth came and exists; it is the sum of promises, God's purpose for all creation in the sum of His Words; it is hid in the hearts of believing men; our love for it is the reason we died by His mercy and his grace, and the reason for our life here and in the hereafter by His mercy and His grace; it is that which made us free, and it is the only means by which we may come to know God and Christ, the only means by which we may appropriate and lay hold of God's gift of eternal life, as it is written: "And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent" (John 17:3).

Final Consideration - Part seven on "The Lord's Table

1 Corinthians 11:26

For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do show the Lord's death till he come.

"The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ?"

What a powerful word we have been given here, "the communion of the blood"

The "communion" of the Blood-The "fellowship" of the Blood-The "association" of the Blood-The "function" of the Blood-The "relation" of the Blood-The "communication" of the Blood of Christ

God has developed the proper perspective that men must have when considering "blood" in His word. God told Noah "But flesh with the life thereof, which is the blood thereof, shall ye not eat." (Genesis 9:4) I know that some do not think anything of eating blood sausage, but they should reconsider! God is very specific when it comes to eating blood, and the Apostle even affirms this in the new covenant era "But that we write unto them, that they abstain from pollutions of idols, and from fornication, and from things strangled, and from blood. (Acts 15:20) - So we can begin to see how foreign it must have been to have Jesus show up and talk about "eating His flesh and drinking His blood" - These scribes and Pharisees did not have a clue what Jesus was talking about.

Throughout scripture God has laid a good foundation for the appreciation of blood.

"communion"

"The communion of the blood."

This word "communion" is a word that is full of meaning.

"The fellowship of the blood of Christ."

When we come around this table and remember Jesus there is a very real and vibrant fellowship with the one that was dead, yet, he is alive forevermore.

There is a fellowship in His death, and a fellowship in His life.

Participation is another aspect of this word.

The participation of the blood of Christ,

The blood of this sacrifice has been sprinkled on us, just as the high priest of old were commanded on the day of atonement to sprinkle the blood of the sacrifice on the people, the blood of this covenant has come, and it has made contact with us, we are participating with the blood of a living person.

"The benefaction of His Blood" "The conferring aid of the blood of Christ"

The blood, or life of Christ, has conferred the ultimate aid to our souls.

And as we gather to remember the price tag that was associated with the conferment of this blessing, we are given to appreciate "the living person of Jesus."

Another way to think about this blood is

Here are some implications of the word

"the communication" of the Blood of Christ.

We know from the revelation of the scriptures that the blood of martyrs speaks against all those who took their life, but we have come to a blood that blesses.

"And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel." (Hebrews 12:24)

When we come around this table we gather "as one man", or as the Holy Spirit said it "one bread."

1 Corinthians 10:17 (KJVS)

For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are

all partakers of that one bread.

There is a special blessing that is enjoyed as we gather together in the body of Christ.

Gathering together **to remember His death** till he come, focusing together to consider "His blessed appearance."

Jesus shall "Appear" with power and glory!

"And now, little children, abide in him; that, when **he shall appear**, we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming." 1 John 2:28

Gathering at this table is required so the saints will be found "watching" when Jesus appears in the clouds! This table of remembrance is essential in the preparation of the hearts, minds and souls of all God's people.

The aggressive nature of Jesus' public ministry is striking, moreover since He is often presented as docile, accommodating, and pliable to the circumstances of human need. However, the scripture record communicates this prominent aspect of His nature, the primary one, it is that He pressed forward the eternal purpose of His Father and no other. Remember how scripture spoke of Him... **Psalms 69:9** "...the zeal

of thine house hath eaten me up." His disciples had to run to keep up with Him, so to speak. Jesus did and said things which continually stunned His listeners and witnesses by its imposing character. Let the implications of this truth fortify your faith to abide in the earth walking in the light of that reality.

Jesus began His pubic work in and around Judea after returning from His confrontation with Satan in the wilderness. Led by the Spirit Jesus was tested for forty days after which the Tempter personally appeared for this duel in the desert. Satan could not resist the opportunity in which he was unsuccessful.

Meanwhile, Luke 4:14 "...Jesus returned

in the power of the Spirit into Galilee: and there went out a fame of him through all the region round about." What was the basis of that 'fame'? Think of these statements by hearers and summations by the gospel writers of His words and works. Some at the beginning and others later in His ministry. Mark 1:22 "And they were astonished at his doctrine: for he taught them as one that had authority, and not as the scribes". In Galilee they were amazed. Luke 4:22 "And all bare him witness, and wondered at the gracious words which proceeded out of his mouth. And they said, 'Is not this Joseph's son?'" Luke 4:36 "And they were all amazed, and spake among themselves, saying, 'What a word is this! for with authority and power he commandeth the unclean spirits, and they come out.'" John records even earlier events in Judea. Jesus' first time in Jerusalem, following the testing by Satan, He violently took control of the Temple area, approximately 30 acres. Jesus of Nazareth imposed His will and removed a market place the priest's allowed to dominate the enviornment. Jesus, a member of the tribe of Judah, wrenched temporary control of the Holy Places in Jerusalem from the chief

priest's and tribe of Levi. Note that these men verbally objected to His actions but did not command the Temple soldiers to arrest Jesus or make any legal charges against Him. Such was the commanding nature of Jesus' presence, words, and works. They feared Him and the crowds who gladly witnessed these things!


Further, John records... John 2:23 "Now when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover, in the feast day, many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did."

The Master would later have more confrontations with these religious elders and their associates. For they followed Him throughout His travels, even into Galilee and east of

the Jordan in the regions called Decapolis and Perea. Pharisees, a very strict sect of traditionalists, once challenged Him and the disciples for picking and eating a few grains on the Sabbath day. Jesus forcefully dismissed their thinking about Sabbath observance and stated the matter of His identity in the same statement. Matthew 12:7-8 "But if ye had known what this meaneth,

'I will have mercy, and not sacrifice,' ye would not have condemned

the guiltless. For the Son of man is Lord even of the sabbath day." His use of Scripture and the claim His identity would strike a thoughtful Jew as stunning, leaving no middle ground. They either believed Him or must charge Him with blasphemy for such words!



Also, Jesus healed on the Sabbath day, many times! This action caused anger and bitter frustration among the Jewish traditionalists. Yet, He met their objections with strong words never shrinking from stating the truth, aggressively. Whether it was scripture truth or the reality of His identity:

Mark 3:1-6 "And he entered again into the synagogue; and there was a man there which had a withered hand. And they watched him, whether he would heal him on the sabbath day; that they might accuse him. And he saith unto the man which had the withered hand, 'Stand forth.' And he saith unto them, 'Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? to save life, or to kill?' But they held their peace. And when he had looked round about on them with anger, being grieved for the hardness of their hearts, he saith unto the man, 'Stretch forth thine hand.' And he stretched it out: and his hand was restored whole as the other. And the Pharisees went forth, and straightway took counsel with the Herodians against him, how they might destroy him."

Luke 13:10-17 "And he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And, behold, there was a woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up herself. And when Jesus saw her, he called her to him, and said unto her, 'Woman, thou art loosed from thine infirmity.' And he laid his hands on her: and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God. And the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because that Jesus had healed on the sabbath day, and said unto the people, 'There are six days in which men ought to work: in them therefore come and be healed, and not on the sabbath day.' The Lord then answered him, and said, 'Thou hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the sabbath loose his ox or his ass from the stall, and lead him away to watering? And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?' And when he had said these things, all his adversaries were ashamed: and all the people rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by him."

Also, as to Jesus' focus and kingdom view of His actions, His mother and brothers came to where He was and attempted to interrupt. However, Jesus refused their request with these words. **Matthew 12:48-50** ""Who is my mother? and who are my brethren?' And he stretched forth his hand toward his disciples, and said, 'Behold my mother and my brethren! For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in

heaven, the same is my brother, and sister, and mother." Some may have thought He broke the fifth commandment to honor your father and mother. However, Jesus would allow no earthly claims to detour His first honoring the heavenly father. Even so, the time of submission to His earthly mother, as He did at age 12, was now past.

And one last observation involves the crowd of 5000 men (not counting women and children) for whom Jesus multiplied the bread and fish to eat. John 6:14-15 "Then those men, when they had seen the miracle that Jesus did, said, 'This is of a truth that prophet that should come into the world.' When Jesus therefore perceived that they would come and take him by force, to make him a king, he departed again into a mountain himself alone." He would not assent to popular will based on human appetites; not social, political, or physical interests. Jesus submitted to no other desires or expectations but the Father's, always pleasing Him regardless of what men thought!

Brethren, let us also do this, as Jesus, with a single eye and heart inclined toward the Father. Scripture is clear as to God's view of such people. 2 Chronicles 16:9 "For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him." And the Psalmist affirms this. Psalms 1:1-3 "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate day and night. And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper."

So, press the battle of righteousness, truth, and the hope of eternal life opened by and in Christ. You will not be ashamed or disappointed! Extend your faith toward the mark of the prize of God's high calling in the Savior. Nothing else will pass approval on the last day of Jesus' appearing and the judgment to which we are all appointed. Let us ready ourselves for it by faith from God Who rewards it abundantly! Even so did He reward our Savior, His Son!



Conflicting principles are now found within us. We have a "heavenly treasure" in an "earthly vessel" (2 Cor.

4:7). In that condition, it is not possible to be without the experience of fierce inner conflict and contradiction. That situation is the source of contradictory feelings, thoughts, and inclinations. Our "earthen vessel" struggles for dominance, and in its conflict with the "treasure" we have our warfare. The "treasure," like Abraham, is found in strange and hostile environment (Heb. 11:19).

Both "light" and "darkness" exist in us. The presence of these moral influences requires diligent effort to "walk as children of light" (Eph. 5:8). Light has no "communion" with darkness (2 Cor. 6:14). No place is this lack of communion as evident as it is within the believer. It becomes the source of incessant struggle.

"God and evil" wrestle within the reconciled, struggling for the dominance (Rom. 7:15-23; 1 Cor. 15:33). The influence of one of these cannot be experienced without the influence of the other. "Good" cannot be pursued without "evil" crying for attention, and "evil" cannot become the focus of attention without "good" objecting. Two contrary voices cry simultaneously, demanding our allegiance.

"The Spirit" and the "flesh" have mutually antithetic desires, and make them known within the redeemed (Gal. 5:17). They "lust" against each other, pulling in opposite directions. Their contrariety is the cause of inner struggle and conflict. The eternal and the temporal orders cry out for the attention of the saints. The sobering reality is that believers have the ability to behold them both (2 Cor. 4:18). This condition requires spiritual vigilance and diligence in the child of God. It is not possible to be passive or casual in this struggle, and still be found "accepted of Him" (2 Cor. 5:9). The presence of warring principles creates a "valley of decision" (Joel 3:14).

There are an "old" and a "new" man within the saved. The "old" is to be subordinated and "put off" by the believer, and the "new" is to be "put on" (Eph. 4:22-24). This cannot be accomplished without hearty effort on the part of the believer. Neither will it be achieved in assemblies of believers that do not contribute to their spiritual strength. The casual sharing of general information and news items will never give the saints an advantage in their warfare. Intellectual treatise of interesting subjects, historical analysis, and humorous anecdotes will not do it either. Leaders that take the warfare seriously will feed the flock. Those that do not should be discharged immediately, and without question. Eternal issues are at stake!

A struggle between life and death rages in everyone that has believed and obeyed the Gospel. It is something in which you are involved. It has to do with eternal life and condemnation, and it was initiated by the introduction of spiritual life.

ANOTHER VIEW OF THE SITUATION

We are living in two conflicting worlds simultaneously. The "world to come" (Heb. 2:5) is now our abode by faith. This "present evil world" (Gal. 1:4) is our tangible residence while we remain "in the body" (2 Cor. 5:8). These are not merely two different worlds. One is destined for destruction (2 Pet. 3:10-12). The other constitutes a "kingdom that cannot be shaken," and will be revealed when the other one is destroyed (Heb. 12:27-28). Until that time, they are irreconcilable. An eternal order cannot be at peace with a temporal one! As a believer in Christ, you have to do with them both, and that is a constant source of inner conflict.

We have also been "espoused" to an absent "Bridegroom" (2 Cor. 11:2). This condition has introduced a conflict of interests. The world solicits us to deny our betrothal and play the harlot with her. No person in Christ is exempt from the struggle. All have received a heavenly mandate to "fight the good fight of faith, and lay hold on eternal life" (1 Tim. 6:12,19). Take the warfare seriously, and have done with things of no eternal consequence. The time is short, the battle is fierce, and your eternal destiny is at stake.

Inner struggle also ensues because part of us is dying, while the other part is being constantly renewed. Our "outward man" is perishing, but our "inward man is renewed day by day" (2 Cor. 4:16). However, the "perishing" part of us is not reconciled to dying! Further, the "inward man" requires that our "affection" be "set on things above, and not on things on the earth" (Col. 3:1-2). However, this can only be accomplished while subduing the earthly proclivities of the "outward man." Thus, the struggle. Matthew Cobb
